### Clergy Support Fund Campaign

This is the first of two important messages about sick and retired priests and the Clergy Support Fund Campaign which is being launched to support them. A priest will normally retire from full time parish ministry when he reaches 75 years of age. Many continue to work in some form of ministry. When a priest retires from his parish ministry or a full time ecclesiastical appointment the Diocesan Finance Office establishes his likely income, which in some cases will be the basic state retirement pension, and his needs on an individual basis. The Finance Office will then ensure he has sufficient financial resources to afford the necessities of life. live in properly heated and adequately maintained accommodation and is able to pay for some recreation and travel. In 2014 when the Campaign was launched there were 70 retired priests in our Diocese and this number is expected to increase to about 93 by 2018. The costs of supporting them are currently met from Diocesan resources and partly from annual contributions from each parish. However, the increase in the number of sick and retired priests will create more pressure on these costs. A summary of the estimated costs, income and shortfall over five years is given below.

Archbishop Peter Smith has therefore identified the need to continue to support sick and retired priests as a major priority for our Diocese to enable them to live in their retirement with dignity and in modest comfort.
