The Thirtieth Sunday

Mass Readings: Pages 155 – 157 Order of Mass: Pages 6 – 60

Today's readings continue the theme of prayer. In a society where money brings power, and injustice can be soothed over by bribery, the poor man's situation is pretty hopeless. Without money and influence, the poor cannot seek legal redress when they are wronged and so are often forced to accept unfair treatment from the better off. But God is a just judge. He shows no partiality to the rich or the powerful. He listens to the prayer of the humble and lowly.

The parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector makes the same point even more forcefully. It brings together the righteous one and the outcast, and it is the latter who comes out best.

The proud Pharisee is replying on his good works. Because of these he thinks that God owes him salvation. The tax collector has nothing to rely on. He knows he is a sinner. So he throws himself on the mercy of God. His words are few, but the attitude of his heart makes him pleasing to God. His humble prayer wins forgiveness.

The parable was aimed at those who prided themselves on being virtuous and despised everyone else. Although he was boastful, the Pharisee was not a hypocrite. The sad fact was that he had no concept of his need of God or grace of forgiveness.

The ending—'everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the man who humbles himself will be exalted' - lifts the parable out of the narrow conflict of Pharisee and tax collector, and turns it into a lesson for everyone.

In the Second reading Paul realises that his captivity will end with his execution. Hence, he speaks of his blood being poured out as a libation to God. Although his death is In sight, his confidence is unshaken, and his hope of a crown of glory is undimmed. His friends have deserted him, his sole supports are faith and prayer. He believes that the Lord will rescue him from every evil and bring him to his heavenly kingdom.
