The strange figure of John the Baptist is placed before us: yet he is the beginning of the *Good News*. The source of consolation for God's people, because his works prepares for the for the work of Christ. The root of our consolation lies in the fact that God is faithful to his word and his promises.

Advent is the Church saying you have four weeks to prepare yourself, your family, friends and neighbours for celebrating of the Birth of Jesus Christ, Son of God and Son of Mary. We are preparing to welcome the *Light of the World* into the darkness of some aspects of our life – violence, marriage breakdown, lack of belief, fall away in prayer and Mass attendance, injustice, homelessness – the list goes on and on.

During Advent the daily and Sunday liturgies are full of hope – looking forward to the Incarnation – the coming of God into this world. In some ways, the atmosphere among people of today can be a bit hopeless, empty, without much vision of the future except in terms of gloom and disaster. Well, let us, as Christians, encourage each other to hope.



This does not mean being overconfident, but refusing to be buried in gloom. Though Jesus Christ may seem a long way away – he has promised he is with us. He keeps his promise here and now today. Are we strong enough and simple enough to believe this?
